Spruce Grouse

The North Shore Forest Eco-Region is characterized by an irregular coastline with rolling hills, has the lowest rainfall and is the warmest coastal area in summer.

The common tree types are Black Spruce, Balsam Fir & White Birch, with White Spruce & Trembling Aspen in less abundance. A varied range of hardwoods are scattered along the rocky hillsides. Mountain Ash (Dogberry), Red Maple, Speckled Alder, Choke Cherry, Mountain Alder, Mountain Maple & Pin Cherry are all present as is Larch, a deciduous conifer.
